Re: Proposed 1988-89 WAVA Budget

Dear Friends:

As we discussed in Melbourne and as is required by the WAVA Constitution, I'm enclosing the proposed WAVA budget for 1988-89.

According to the By-Laws, "the Treasurer's proposed budget shall cover the period until the next General Assembly and shall be subject to approval by a majority of the Council by mail within 30 days of receipt; any member of the Council who fails to respond in writing shall be regarded as approving the proposed budget."

However, because most (or all) of us will be meeting in Eugene on April 28, I suggest we postpone final budget approval until then. I don't expect any major expenditures before then. I would still appreciate your comments and proposed budget changes. But, if there are no objections, we'll approve the budget in Eugene, rather than by mail.

Outgoing Treasurer Alastair Lynn has already sent you his final financial statement -- through January 26, 1988. On January 29, he wire-transferred most of the WAVA funds into a U.S. dollar account at a California bank.

Two signatures, including the Treasurer's, are required on all checks. I will be mailing a signature card to the other four signators agreed upon in Melbourne -- President, Secretary, Vice-President (T&F), and North American Regional Delegate.

As we also agreed in Melbourne, I'll contact President Beccalli by Fax to get fast approval for an expense, then get another signature for the check.

ANALYSIS OF EACH BUDGET ITEM

REVENUES:

- 1. Affiliate Fees. We expect \$5800 in 2nd-installment fees.
- 2. Entry Fees. We expect another \$4800 in fees from Melbourne. I'm conservatively projecting 4000 entries in Eugene, at \$14 each, for a total of \$56,000. The Eugene organizers are predicting from 5000 to 7000, and I hope they're right. But several developments could adversely affect participation, such as an impending recession, the Denmark Games cutting into European competitors, lack of U.S. publicity, etc.
- 3. Sanction Fee. \$12,000, to be paid by the Eugene Organizing Committee.
- 4. Interest. Estimated \$3500 in bank interest.
- 5. Miscellaneous. \$500 in affiliate fees from Belgium -- already paid by the Belgians but awating collection from a Belgian bank.

Total Estimated Revenues: \$82,600

EXPENSES:

- 1. Typing, mail, phone, etc. Since the current accounting period will be 20 months (Feb. 1, 1988 thru Sept. 30, 1989) and the 1985-87 period was 28 months, I've projected 70 percent (20/28) of the 1985-87 period for the President, Secretary and Treasurer. I've also budgeted \$300 for each sports V-P, and \$100 for the Executive V-P and Women's Representative. Total \$5200.
- 2. Financial Charges. We spent \$1125 on insurance in 1985-87, but it doesn't seem to be a necessary expense, so I've dropped it, leaving only \$150 for bank and auditing expenses.
- 3. Statistics and Communication.
 - a. Records Chairman -- \$500, the same as 1985-87.
 - b. National Masters News -- \$200 per month, the same as 1985-87 (NMN has already received \$1200 for Jan-June, 1988, leaving 15 months at \$200 for a total of \$3000.)
 - c. WAVA Handbook -- \$4500, the same as 1985-87.
 - d. Australian & British veteran publications -- \$1000 each. Both publications operate on a financial shoestring, and contribute to the interest in WAVA's program in each country.
 - e. Decathlon Tables \$1000 to help defray expenses of the new subcommittee developing decathlon/heptathlon tables.
 - f. Age-Graded Tables \$1000 to help defray expenses of the new subcommittee developing age-graded tables. Total: \$12,000.

Analysis of Each Budget Item - page 2 4. Presentations. \$650 for presentations in 1989 in Eugene. 5. Development. In 1985-87, we contributed \$250 to Oceania for equipment. The proposed \$1500 could be used for similar developmental expenses, to help encourage veteran athletics in areas currently without a viable veterans program. 6. International Meetings. I've budgeted \$8700 for Eugene '88 and \$14,000 for Eugene '89 for a total of \$22,700. The Eugene organizers are contractually bound to pay some WAVA travel expenses; WAVA has generally paid some others. The detailed breakdown is shown on the chart: "Anticipated Travel Expenses." For Eugene 1988, the OC (organizing committee) pays for four air fares; WAVA pays four, and also pays \$300 of the air fare of each Regional delegate. The OC pays for four hotel rooms, WAVA pays the others. For Eugene, 1989, WAVA pays the air fare of the eight officers, and pays \$300 of the air fare of each Regional Delegate. Eugene pays the hotel rooms of all 13 Council members. In both 1988 and 1989, WAVA pays \$35 a day per diem to each Council member. I also recommend that WAVA pay the air fare to the Games of the Records Chairman (\$250). Also in the proposed budget is \$1150 for dinner and miscellaneous expenses in 1989 in Eugene. (In Melbourne, we spent \$1011.55). 7. Miscellaneous. Nothing budgeted. 8. President's Travel. Cesare may have to attend meetings in connection with WAVA business, so \$2000 is budgeted. Total Estimated Expenses: \$44,200. Since estimated revenues are \$82,600 and estimated expenses are \$44,200, we expect a net profit of \$38,400. Together with our current bank balance of \$47,256.44, that would give us a balance on Sept. 30, 1989 of \$85,656.44. I'm reminded of the nation of Gabon. For years the government operated without a budget. It had so much money it didn't need one. After years of poverty, WAVA is now not only in the black, but quite well off. We should give serious thought to whether we want to spend more than is currently budgeted, or whether we want to keep saving as much as possible.

WAVA TREASURER'S REPORT by AL SHEAHEN, New Treasurer

Outgoing Treasurer Alastair Lynn and I met Friday to plan a smooth transition of the Treasurer's functions.

- 1) He gave me the format of the letter he's used to bill the affiliates their biennial dues.
- 2) Alastair will close the current books on January 15, 1988, since it will take that long to get the Melbourne revenue and other expenses resolved.
- 3) WAVA's flunds in the two WAVA accounts (savings & checking) will be transferred from a Toronto bank to a Los Angeles bank on January 15, 1988.
- 4) After I receive Alastair's final report on January 15, I will prepare a budget, as the Constitution instructs the Treasurer to do, and submit it to the Council by January 31. Fall 15
- 5) If anyone has any specific budget requests, please let me know today or prior to January 15, 1988.
- 6) Alastair and I recommend that no change be made in the By-Laws regarding the keeping of WAVA funds in U.S. dollars.
- 7) We recommend that \$300 be allocated in the budget for expenses for both the Track & Field, and Long Distance Chairmen.
- 8) In the budget, we recommend that travel expenses to the World Games be paid for the Records Chairman.
- Alastair, Cesare and I suggest that, to facilitate the signing of checks, we utilize five potential signers: 1) Treasurer, who must sign all checks;
 President; 3) North American Chairman; 4) Track & Field Chairman;
 Secretary. Reasoning: If Pain, Fine and Lynn were authorized signers, I could forward checks to them for signature quickly, since they all live in North America. Cesare could authorize payments by facsimile machine.

To implement this, a change in the By-Laws is needed: Section 6, paragraph 11: "All cheques shall be signed by the Treasurer and counter-signed by the President or by any Vice-President so authorised in writing by the President."

Propose it be changed to read: "All cheques shall be signed by the Treasurer and counter-signed by the President or by any Council member so authorized in writing by the President."
