

Sandy Pashkin Selected To USATF Hall of Fame

Longtime OTC member and volunteer, Sandy Pashkin, was selected for the USA Track & Field Masters Hall of Fame.

Pashkin, a 17-year OTC member, is being recognized for her almost six-decade contribution to the sport of track and field and as an administrator for Masters activities at the local, national, and international levels.

Pashkin will be formally inducted into the Hall of Fame at the USATF Masters Outdoor Championships scheduled for Ames, IA in July. She was inducted into the City College of New York Sports Hall of Fame in 2016.

Pashkin has served in various officer positions in the Oregon Track Club and the OTC Masters group. Currently she is the Masters treasurer. For many years, she has played a vital role in putting on the OTCM Hayward Classic Meet.

Pashkin became a USATF certified official in 1961, the same year that she became the American women's record holder in the 880m while competing for the City College of New York. She served as the track and field coach for Hunter College High School in New York City. Later, she was a National Masters champion and record holder in several events.

She is the current Records Committee Chair for the World Masters Athletics organization. Pashkin is the former president of the North and Central America and Caribbean Region of World Masters Athletics. Pashkin served for many years as the Chair of the USATF Masters Records Committee.
