JACQUES ACCAMBRAY--KENT STATE--Winner of Hammer

"We (Al Schoterman) and I originally considered trying to throw both at Penn and here, after Al won at Penn last year and I won here. He refused later because of not having a good spring and he was afraid of a repeat of last year when he faded later in the season and lost to me in the NCAA Finals. I like the ring here but it was very difficult to get psyched up when there is no one to compete with here. I throw much better when I am facing Schoterman. I wanted to do better here than last year, I did very poorly after breaking my hammer. I didn't get psyched up until the last throw and I would have done better than 213-7, but I hooked the throw (throw was for 208.6). Now I am ready to go home, but I want to watch Jim Ryun run once."

FRANK SHORTER--FLORIDA TRACK CLUB--Winner of the Six-Mile Run, Winning time 27:38.0.

"I'm happy with the race, it was very relaxing and enjoyable. I was trying for a new record but some days they just don't come. Anyway, it doesn't mean much to run good times at this time of the year. I want to be at my peak for the Olympics."

"I have been sick with dysentary infection for the last three weeks. I'm six pounds underweight, and six pounds is an awful lot to me. I weigh about 125 right now."

"You have to give a lot of credit to Neil Cusach of East Tennessee for making a race out of it. He needed a good time here in order to qualify for the Olympics. When he tried to make the lead near the end, I had to make my move. I was coasting until about the last mile."

"The sickness caused me to run very badly at the Kansas Relays last week, so I went to Colorado and ran 17 miles a day in the snow last week in order to get ready for today."

JACK BACHELER--FLORIDA TRACK CLUB--2nd Place in Six-Mile Run (27:38.1)

"This race was a struggle for me all the way."



LUCIAN ROSA--Winner of the Marathon from the University of Wisconsin-Parkside (Kenosha, Wisconsin), New Drake Relays record 2 hours, 22 minutes, 13 seconds.

He is single, 5' 6½", 104 pounds and 27 years old, freshman at UW-Parkside,

Majoring in Business Management and Physical Education. Home is Ceylon.

Parkside is a four-year school, enrollment of 4,200.

"I took the lead between the 11th and 12th mile and kept it until the finish.

I figure that I've lost about five pounds during the race. I drank about 7

cups of Gatorade and one cup of water while running. I had no problems with traffic."

"This is only the second time that I've run the Marathon, and the first time I've worn shoes for an entire race."

"I was the 1970 Asian Games Champion in the 5000 Meters (14:12.2) and the 10,000 meters (29:55.6). That was when I first met Coach Bob Lawson of Parkside. His training has helped me a great deal, in fact, he talked me into running the Marathon here."

"I finished 16th in the NAIA Cross-Country meet last November at Liberty, Missouri."

"I am on Ceylon's Olympic Team and I plan to leave for Munich in June to begin my training for the 10,000 meters and the Marathon."

GORDON MINTY--EASTERN MICHIGAN--Anchor man (ran Mile) in their Drake Relays tying time of 9:43.4--from London, England, been in States for 3 years, sophomore (24 years old).

"I ran the Three-Mile yesterday and was quite tired before today's race. I knew I would have to stay close to the lead in order to take advantage of my kick. I was relaxed that last lap and that helped me."

RODNEY MILBURN--SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY--Winner 120 Yard Hurdles, Junior, 22 years old.

"I'm glad to have won but I ran a lousy race. Usually, I concentrate on technique but I couldn't today because I didn't have time to warm up, so I was still a little tight."

"The wetness of the track and the false start did not have any effect on me. I had plenty of traction."

"I feel that if the weather would have been good I could have run a :13.0 or :13.1 today, but I'm concerned about peaking too early. Therefore, I haven't been working out too hard lately."

"I have definite aspirations to play pro football after the Olympics. In fact, I plan to go out for football this fall at Southern. I was a receiver and defensive back in high school. The Dallas Cowboys have shown interest in me being a flanker."

RICK GROSS--ILLINOIS--Anchor man for Illinois in Distance Medley.

"I could hear him (Howe) coming and just couldn't respond. I died mentally. That's awfully embarrassing to have a five second lead and blow it. The other three men ran World Record legs and I can't, some anchor man."

FRED DeBERNARDI--UTEP--Shot Put Winner--Winning Toss 60' 10 $\frac{1}{4}$ "

"I'm glad I won but I'm certainly not happy with my effort. I threw 65' 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " last week at the Kansas Relays. Today, the circle was wet and slippery--especially during the prelims when I have my best throws. My strength is excellent for this event but my form needs work. Des Moines is an out-of-sight place but a little wet."

GEORGE DANIELS--COLORADO--Anchor man on Colorado's winning 440-Yard Relay Team

"After doing so bad in the 880-Relay yesterday, our team got together and decided to run Cliff Branch first today instead of his usual second. I think it helped because Illinois' first man is their slowest, so we got an early lead."

JIM RYUN--Finished next to last in Special Mile--Ran 4:09.0

"I have been suffering, from what the doctors have called an intestinal virus, since after the Kansas Relays last week-end. I wanted to run well and felt no pressure before the race, but I got a stomach cramp after the first 660 or so and that was all. I knew I would finish but I didn't know if it would be gross."

HERE WASHINGTON--MICHIGAN STATE SENIOR--Winner of 100-Yard Dash--21 years old.

"This race was better than my efforts yesterday. But I was extremely concerned with the condition of the track. It was so slippery I wasn't sure if I was going to fall on my face coming out of the blocks or not."

"I like to run in much warmer weather also, like about 75° and on up. It took me 50 minutes to get loose today."

"All of those false starts really bother me. They take away from your mental concentration. I never try to guess the starter and "roll" out of the blocks. The only place I might try something like that is in New York, where the starters are consistantly inconsistent--and you can quote that!"

"I have never boasted about being an outdoor runner but I feel like I can beat anyone if I put my mind to it. I favor indoor though."

"I am much stronger this year, I never lifted my knees the whole race today. It was all fluid."

"The Baltimore Colts drafted me and I plan to give pro football a shot, as a split end, after the Olympics."

BARRY SCHUR--KANSAS UNIVERSITY--Winner of High Jump--20 year old sophomore--

Winning Jump (7') defeats world record holder Pat Matzdorf (Wisconsin) on fewer misses.

"The grass in the approach area was very slippery today, and that eliminated the possibility of any good jumps. In fact, all of the jumpers wanted to go inside but the officials insisted so we had no choice. It feels good to beat Matzdorf but I wish it wouldn't have rained."

(Big 10 champ in 1000 Meters)

"I'm very happy with this race. The time (4:03.1) is my personal best in the Mile."

"During the third lap someone gave me an elbow while passing on the far turn.

Fortunately I wasn't hurt. I guess those things just happen sometime."

"Even though I also won the Mile last week at the Kansas University Relays (4:04.0),

I'm not real serious about the Mile. I have enough speed, but until I get stronger

the half-mile is still my favorite."

LLOYD WILLS--LSU--Anchor man on LSU winning Mile-Relay Team--21 year old junior

(Ran a :45.7 anchor today)

"We are extremely happy to win today, especially against a team like Oklahoma State who won at Texas and Kansas in this event."

"Our team was unsure of itself today because of our poor showing yesterday in the Sprint Medley."

"I have felt weak all week-end and I received the baton in third place."

"Watch out Germany!"

DAVE ROBERTS--RICE UNIVERSITY--Pole Vault winner--Winning Vault 17-5--20 year old junior, 175 pounds.

"I really love to compete here, the weather is usually good and of course the fans are second to none."

"I won last week at the Kansas Relays but only vaulted 16-6. I think that was because I was too serious, and got myself all wound up inside. Today I made myself be more loose and it payed off."

"My personal best is 17-6 $\frac{1}{2}$ , and I know I'm capable of 18-0, but I haven't practiced at that height yet. I thought I would make it today on the last jump but I looked up and missed the box with my pole."

"I was using a new pole today for the first time. It was lighter and I think it had a psychological effect on me."

TOM FARRELL--Winner of High School Two-Mile--16 year old freshman, Dowling High School--winning time 9:30.8.

"I think I was about the fifth person in the stadium this morning. I got here around 8:00 a.m. and since all of the gates were locked, I came in through the stadium tunnel."

"My personal best before this race today was 9:51.8, which was a school record."

"I really can't explain why I ran so well today. Maybe it was just the excitement of being in the Drake Relays. All of my preparation the past week was geared for this race. I did more distance running in practice last week, and generally took it easy."

"I didn't know what to expect in the way of a pace, but I wanted to stay near the leaders. I didn't want to fall behind early like I did last week in the Valley Relays. I knew I could win if I stayed near the lead because I have tremendous confidence in my kick."

"My goal in the Two-Mile this year was 10:05."

"I like to think of track as fun and run only when I want to. I'll only run  $\frac{1}{2}$  miles per night after normal practice."

MARK SMITH--INDEPENDENCE HIGH SCHOOL--Winner of High School Discus with Drake Relays--record throw of 170' 10".

"I think I could have thrown farther today but Randy (Lessman of Sioux City East) and I psyched each other out."

"Today was just too nice a day. I do better on a cold day. Like last week at UNI when I threw my personal best of 183' 11"."

"I threw the winner on my third toss in the preliminaries. I always throw better in the prelims because that's when I feel the strongest."
