MARK JOHNSON--Winner of High School Two-Mile in New Drake Relays

Record of 9:06.3, betters previous mark of 9:23.7.

"I felt that this would definitely be a 2-man race between Frank Richardson (of Sac City) and myself. Richardson made a comment to the newspapers last week that he was going to beat me today. It didn't make me mad, but it really fired me up. I really respect Frank though, he's a good runner."

"The race went just like I wanted. I wanted to run about 4:29 for the first mile and as it turned out I ran 4:30. The thing that really helped me was that the crowd was behind me all the way, so that I didn't feel all alone out there."

"Before today, my previous best time was 9:17.6, but I knew I was much better than that. I had that time indoors at Lamoni while running without spikes for the 16 laps. I also beat Richardson at that race (he ran a 9:25)."

"I have geared my workouts for the Relays for over a month. I run about 5 or 6 miles every morning before school and 6 or 7 after school."

"I thought I could have won here last year but I pulled a muscle in my right knee and that prevented me from competing."

"I had to come back this year from that injury, so that people wouldn't say I was affected by it."

"I won't decide on a college until mid-May. All three of the state schools have contacted me along with Wisconsin. I want to major in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science. I'm a straight "A" student at Mason City. I'll probably run the 3-Mile and the 6-Mile in college."

Scott Bringhurst--Utah, Winner of 6-Mile Run. Time: 27:40.0

"I was pleased with my race today although I had hoped for a faster time, but I found it harder to push myself once I had the big lead. I had no idea I would set the pace for the entire race. Except for a point at the two mile mark when my stomach got a little queasy, I felt strong. I have been pointing for this meet and did not train for the last two days. My coach wanted me to run here and have a good time for the race. I didn't run at Texas or at Kansas because Utah doesn't have a lot of money to spend. In fact, I made the trip here alone because one team has a dual meet with New Mexico tonight."

"I am 24 years old and majoring in Physical Education at Utah. I got started in track just by accident. As a sophomore in high school the coach of the cross country team was in the halls looking for runners--so I went out for the team and things started falling into place. My first love in athletics was basketball, but my coordination was never good."

"I started going to Utah in 1966 and after two years there I went on to a religious mission in Texas from 1968 to 1970. After that I spent some time in the Air National Guard before coming back to school."

Lucian Rosa--Winner of Marathon for 2nd year in a row. From Ceylon originally.

"This race seemed easier to me than last year and was a lot more fun. Last year I took the lead at the eight mile mark and ran alone for the rest of the race. This year I ran with a group of about 6 or 7 other guys, and until I took the lead at the 21 mile mark we talked a lot to pass the time."

"This was a nice workout for me, I was never worried about the outcome. There was nothing for me to shoot for. I like this course a lot because of the hills. I'm probably best suited for the marathon because I never get cramps."

"I knew my time was much slower than last year when I was told at the 20-mile mark that my time was 1:57. That was my time at the 22-mile mark last year."

"This is the 7th time I've run the marathon and I probably won't reach my peak until I'm 31 or 32 (he's 29 now). The marathon I ran here at Drake last year was only the second time I had run the race."

"I'm majoring in business management at Wisconsin-Parkside, but I'd like to coach someday."

Dan Cloeter--Anchorman for Concordia in Distance Medley Relay

"When I received the baton I was in second place, so I wanted to make a run at the leader at the end of the third lap. Everything went well and I was able to go all out after failing to qualify for the open 3-Mile yesterday."

"This breaks our school record (10:19) that we set last week at Kansas all to heck. Our time (10.01) is just unbelievable, this crowd can inspire a runner."

Mike Boit--Anchor for Eastern New Mexico Distance Medley Relay.

"I didn't realize I was so close to the record here, I was just running to win the race."

"I have enjoyed the U.S. since arriving here in January. The biggest change for me is that the climate is so different from Kenya."

Barb Lawson--Winner of the Women's Mile

"I thought I could have run 4:50 today but I ran the first lap much too fast, I ran the first quarter in 66 seconds when I should have been 70."

"I won this same event here 2 years ago but I wasn't invited last year because I was told I was too good. I was upset about that but I wanted to come back this year because it's such a good meet."

"I ran the $\frac{1}{2}$ -mile at Kansas last week and finished 3rd, I prefer the mile."

"I am pointing for the outdoor nationals in July out in California."

Tom Craig--Oklahoma--Winner of Pole Vault

"I'm always very happy to win of course, but I really thought I'd do much better than 16'6" today. Usually Drake is where I can get it all together. In 1971, I vaulted 17 feet and in 1972 I vaulted 17'1"."

"If I had a choice between winning and vaulting 17 feet--I'd take the vault everytime."

"But this is the first watch I've ever won and I'm happy about that. It seems as if I'm always barely beaten out for the watch."

Marshall Dill--Michigan State--Winner of 100-Yard Dash

"I'm always happy to win, regardless of the time. I think the false start we had hurt Dean Williams. He caused it so of course he had to lay back and couldn't get out as fast."

"I owe a lot of my success to Herb Washington. Herb taught me how to prepare mentally for a race, and made me a more classy sprinter. Now I'm able to use more finesse in my races, whereas in high school I was a pure muscle sprinter."

"I'm pointing for the world games at Russia."

Sam Walker--SMU--Winner of Shot Put

"I'm happy with the win, but not with my distance. They should do something about this throwing area though, because it is definitely uphill."

"I consider myself very lucky to have competed today. This morning the elbow on my throwing arm was very sore. I guess I slept funny on it last night. This never happened to me before and I was concerned that perhaps my arm was hyperextended. Luckily, the elbow felt all right after I put some heat on it and warmed up for a long time. But now it's sore again. I figure this cost me 2 feet in distance today."

Barry McClure--Middle Tennessee--Winner of Triple Jump

"This is quite a comeback for me because I missed 18 days of practice this month because of some sort of blood disorder. The doctor says it might be mononeculosis. Because of this I was naturally concerned about my strength and speed. But fortunately I was mentally ready and able to relax."

Dean Williams--Kansas State Anchor Man for 440-Yard Relay

"We were concerned about Kansas and Texas but everything went near perfect for us. Our team just loves to come and compete. We want to take the races one at a time."

"What really made this possible today was that our leadoff runner, Josh Washington, was healthy today. He pulled a groin muscle only 2 weeks ago but the treatment he received from our trainer Steve Long was great."

Howell Michael--Marines--Winner of Open Mile

"I wanted to make my move earlier but I was boxed in on the back stretch and had to wait."

"This is a very satisfying win however because I hurt my foot in Trinidad only 3 weeks ago--and that really hurt my training. I knew Hilton was the man to beat here."

"I thought this would be a sub-4 minute race but the 2nd lap was just too slow."

"I am a first lieutenant stationed at Quantico, Virginia, and I'm looking forward to our Marine Relays next week."

Jeff Myers--Davenport West--Winner of High School Mile

"I decided before the race to let Chuck Burger (of Sioux City Heelan) lead and I would try to outrick him at the end. This is the fastest mile I've run all year and the reason might I've run all year and the reason might be because of the weather today. I don't like a real hot day to run."

Mike Durkin--Illinois--Winner of Mile

"I wanted to hang back and kick the last 300 yards--but my strategy was almost fouled up when the two guys I was running behind on the back stretch almost stopped. I had to slow down and go around them but fortunately I made up the lost ground."
