Jack Gaver, who trains the Greentree Stable colt, said Woodchopper was due to arrive at Churchill Downs today and have a major workout Tuesday.

As to why he changed his mind about sending Woodchopper to the Derby, Gaver said: "I thought Cure The Blues would destroy his field in the Wood Memorial (he finished third), and then the horse that finished 11th in the Louisiana Derby (Law Me) came back to be second to Proud Appeal in the Blue Grass. Those two occurrences made us reassess the situation."
