Len Sitko. Illinois: Anchor Winning Men's 4X1600-Meter Relay in 16:34.16

lowa State won five in a row and we wanted to put an end to that. The guys (legs) kind of put me in a place to win. I knew Jon Brown of lowa State had 'stuff', had lot of experience winning and would be tough to beat. The guys put me on the leader and I let Brown do all the work (run in the lead). That was the bottom line. We have four people capable. We thought we could do it (win) and we did.

He had the lead right off the bat so I figured I would let him lead the whole way. If he (Brown) was going to win, he would have to go out hard. I decided to sit back and relax and stay with him and wait for the last 200 meters and then kick it hard.

This is the first time I won a (relay) race at Drake. This is lowa State's home state and beating them was a pretty big win to me.

Jim deBeers. Illinois: who ran opening leg on 4X1600 Relay:

We are all seniors so this is a great win for us. We have been here before but we never put together a relay that had a chance to win. To come in and win when lowa State is perennial champions makes it an important win especially because it was an Illinois record that they were attempting to break.

Jon Brown. lowa State: Anchor leg of second-place 4X1600 Relay team in 16:38.98:

(Sitko) is a very good miler and he made a good move in the final part of the race when he passed me. I thought we would be farther ahead at the beginning of the race.

This was a tough race for me because I was tired and it (losing) is very disappointing.

Bill Betterton, Carlisle: Winner High School Boys 110-Meter High Hurdles in :4.15, DRAKE RELAYS RECORD

I got out quick and then closed my eyes and ran as fast as I could.

This is really satisfying (getting his second Drake win). I wanted to go to :13 but this is OK. It was a very important race to me ... a very emotional win.

I knew for sure I had it half way through the race and I was just flying. I've been sick all week and have been running a temperature, so I'm scratching on the 400 hurdles and saving it for the long jump tomorrow.

Suzie Darnell. Knoxville: Winner High School Girls 100-Meter Dash, :12.57.

I feel I got out really fast - then I realized I was ahead and just kept going. I haven't run this race much all year. I was just a little more pumped up today. My coach, Randy Wilson, isn't here because of a funeral, so we decided we wanted to do something good for him.. I was trying to run my race, and I didn't worry about anybody else. I usually run the 100 hurdles and some relays for our team.

Curtis Hawkins. Ames: Winner High School Boys 100-Meter Dash, :10.74

The start is what did it for me, I beat everybody out of the blocks. I just wanted to stay focused, get out of the blocks and run my race. I just stayed with what I wanted to do.

There are so many good runners here, its an honor to win here. Winning the state meet gave me all the confidence in the world.

Ken Popejoy. Wheaton. III., who defended title in Masters' 800-Meter Run, in 1:57.39.

This is a thrill for me, winning my second straight time here. I was hoping to get a record, but the wind off the back stretch really held me up.

I'm leaving later to catch a plane to the Penn Relays to run in the Masters' mile. I told them I couldn't miss running at the Drake Relays. This is where my heart is. This is the best track meet in the country, unquestionably.

It's great for a 41-year-old lawyer who anchored his four-mile relay college team to victory here 20 years ago to show some of these kids the older guys can still do it.

Members of lowa City High which won High School Boys 4 x 800-Meter Relay in 8:06.25.

Josh Briggs, lead-off runner: We got some great guys and had a great team effort. I knew if I started out strong the rest of the guys would pull it out.

We have a lot of heart and determination, we had a goal to win at Drake (Relays) and that's what we did.

Nile Heefner. anchor: It was a team effort, just a great race for all of us. We have a strong team, and I've anchored this race myself all season.

<u>Dave Laughlin. No. 2 runner:</u> We wanted to give our coach a victory here for the first time in his 25 years at City High. This is great to get our school's first relays win since 1960.

Wisconsin: Winner Women's Distance Medley Relay in 11:08.32 seconds, -- a Drake Relays record.

#### Kim Sherman, second-leg:

I don't think we were thinking record...we were thinking going for the win. You go all out and try to run the best you can and results like this happen. This is the first time we have all run together as a distance medley reley so we were surprised how much the crowd supported and helped us. Since we all race tomorrow, it was nice to have a race that went so well.

#### Paul McMullen. Eastern Michigan second-leg:

My strategy was to make sure I got the baton without falling down...it was very hectic. I am kind of a bigger guy and I am suppose to hold my position good. When I got the baton I was suppose to run a hard race and pick up a few guys if I could.

<u>Joey Woody. Iowa City High</u>, Winner of High School Boys 400-meter low hurdles in :52.45.

I felt strong toward the end, though I messed up on a few hurdles, but I ran well and I felt good.

I really like the Relays, the competition is good and the big names like Michael Johnson. It's fun to do this with my teamates, its a great feeling. The 4 X 800 team helped to enthuse me to run.

Jared Bruggeman, anchor for North Dakota's winning 4x800 relay clocked in 7:36.4: I went out good all the way to the finish.

<u>Nathan Swenson:</u> I knew that if I kept it close at the beginging that Jared would win in the end. After placing for the past five years we knew that this year was our best chance to win here.

Kory Zimney: I'm a senior and I knew that we would have our best chance to win this year, if it was going to happen this is when we would do it.

Jason Rouser, anchor for Oklahoma's winning Men's University 4x200 relay in 1:21,95

This weather isn't bad - we have eight inches of snow in Lincoln.

We enjoy coming here and we want to run with more confidence heading into the Southwest Conference meet next week. We haven't had a meet yet this season where all of us have run well at the same time. Usually we have three good legs and one bad leg or three bad legs and one good one.

I've been doing 60 (seconds) on my last laps most every race so I knew I could do that. It was really too cold to go for one of those great times. I knew if I could just hang on until that last lap then I could out kick them (the Bati brothers of lowa City West, Ambo and Roba) so that was my major plan. The other times I've been here I've always been boxed in or way in the back so I made it a point to get out early."
