



Christine Gray, Prairi View A&M, Winner Women's Triple Jump -- 42-1.



Heidi Reed, Augustana, SD-- Winner of Women's 5000-meter run (slow section) 17:23.19

"It's nice to be done this early in the morning. This is the first time I've been here. It's a really nice track-fast. It isn't exactly what I expected, but it's fast. I don't know if I got the time I was hoping for, but the field really kept me going. My coach yelling my splits to me helped too. This is a great place to run."

Simeon Wright, Dubuque Senior, Winner High School Boys' 3200-meter run, 9:24.20 (Wright is a two-time state cross country champ and has signed with Iowa State)

It's great. This is the first time I've really done well. I knew I'd do well. I wasn't sure if I'd win it or not. It's probably the biggest moment in my track career. If I didn't take the lead they could get me on the kick. A lot of those runners can really kick well.

Amy Oleson, Dubuque Senior, Winner High School Girls' High Jump, 5'10 (Oleson broke the Iowa All-Time Best with this jump. Holi Harberts of Walnut and Janine Grammel of Dubuque Wahlert shared the old record of 5-9 1/2.)

I came here to jump my best and I did just that. This feels really good - jumping the highest in the state. Earlier this year, I just missed making 5-10. So I knew I would make this height at some point. I just didn't know when. I will certainly try harder to go higher.

I think this is a great accomplishment. Yes I have reached my goals, earlier I set my goal at breaking the school mark, 5'8. But my goal, I think, is too jump my height (6'1). This is a special win for me because I was working the high jump when (Janine) Gremmel of Wahlert tied the record. This is nice.

Marko Wahlman, Texas-El Paso, Winner Univ-Coll. Hammer Throw in Drake Relays Record 71.48 (234-6)

I came here to do my best. I'm happy with my mark. It's just a half-meter off my personal best. It is always an honor to break a meet record. I understand they have not had the hammer throw for many years, but I'm glad they added it again.

It's my first semester at UTEP and it's really too hot for me in Texas. There's still snow now in Finland. I liked the cold and the wind today.
