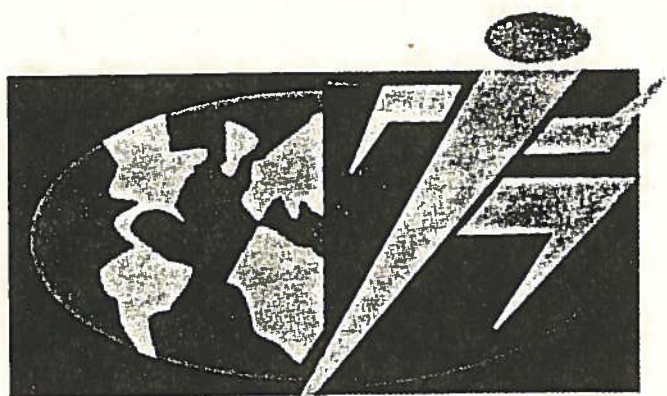

**Christine Gray, Prairi View A&M, Winner Women's Triple Jump -- 42-1.**

It was a good competition here today. I took off on my first jump and that turned out to be the longest. I hope to finish in the top four in the 400 hurdles here at Drake. The triple jump is my favorite event now and I've been taking more of an interest in it. I hope to go at least 43-something before the season is over.

The Drake Relays is a special meet for us. Our coaches sometimes tell us it's nicknamed the "Prairie View Relays" because we've won so many times here. They do put a lot of emphasis on us doing well here.

**Shawn Young, Saydel of Des Moines, Winner High School Boys High Jump -- 6-9.**

I have an inflamed hamstring but that didn't seem to bother me today. My coach wouldn't let me do anything hard in practice this week, just some jogging and stretching. But I was up at 6 a.m. this morning preparing. It's really the psychological attitude that matters most.

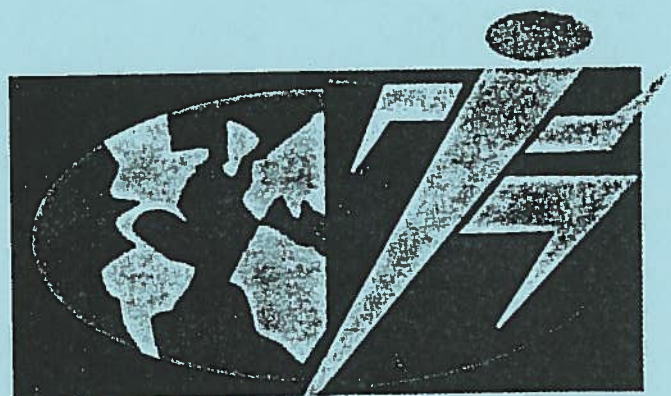

It's great. This is the first time I've really done well. I knew I'd do well. I wasn't sure if I'd win it or not. It's probably the biggest moment in my track career. If I didn't take the lead they could get me on the kick. A lot of those runners can really kick well.

**Amy Oleson, Dubuque Senior, Winner High School Girls' High Jump, 5'10** (Oleson broke the Iowa All-Time Best with this jump. Holi Harberts of Walnut and Janine Grammel of Dubuque Wahlert shared the old record of 5-9 1/2.)

I came here to jump my best and I did just that. This feels really good - jumping the highest in the state. Earlier this year, I just missed making 5-10. So I knew I would make this height at some point. I just didn't know when. I will certainly try harder to go higher.

I think this is a great accomplishment. Yes I have reached my goals, earlier I set my goal at breaking the school mark, 5'8. But my goal, I think, is too jump my height (6'1). This is a special win for me because I was working the high jump when (Janine) Gremmel of Wahlert tied the record. This is nice.

**Marko Wahlman, Texas-El Paso, Winner Univ-Coll. Hammer Throw in Drake Relays Record 71.48 (234-6)**

I came here to do my best. I'm happy with my mark. It's just a half-meter off my personal best. It is always an honor to break a meet record. I understand they have not had the hammer throw for many years, but I'm glad they added it again.

It's my first semester at UTEP and it's really too hot for me in Texas. There's still snow now in Finland. I liked the cold and the wind today. I don't know whether I'll be able to come back next year to defend this title. I'm studying medicine in Finland and next will be a very hard year. I do like competing here. This is a nice facility, even if the cage is a little too close.

**Jim Spivey, Asics, Winner of Men's Special Invitational 5,000 -- 13:58.81**

I was probably more nervous here than when I was at the Olympics, with it being the first race of the year and being inducted. I saw him [Josephat Kapkory] take off and I didn't think I would catch up because he's such a quality athlete. I saw him start to fall, like the Alabama runner from yesterday, so I decided that I would have to make a run after him. With three laps to go I started to make my run and he could have smoked me, he's probably had more speed work than I have.

When I started after him I was hoping the crowd would get into it. I could really hear them today, I knew that there weren't any pole vaulters or long jumps going. I had the confidence that I could catch him and with the crowd behind me I was able to do it.

It is quite an honor to compete as a Hall of Famer here. Most of the Hall of Famers sit in the stands and watch by the time they are in.
