Scheduling Difficulties

With the growing popularity of senior running and road racing in general it is becoming increasingly difficult to find track and field facilities available at a time when a meet will not be in competition with some other popular running event. The competition for dates during middle or late May (a suitable time for a track meet between our May 6 and June 3 meets) was overwhelming. Joe Carey comments on this and other matters.....

Fellow members of NCSTC:

I've competed with you, I've worked as meet director for us, I've written reports for this bulletin, and I've attended one very critical meeting of club officers. I've enjoyed the benefits of your efforts along these same lines for almost two years.

I want to introduce some provocative comments. I think they are timely, because right now our club, like many similar organizations, is in the throes of expansion.

- 1. We ought to advertise the club more effectively, but only if the publicity is directed toward some worthy purpose. As I see it, the primary worthy purpose for ourselves and for society in general will be to swell our membership with the many joggers and competitive runners, presently unaffiliated, who are now enjoying the benefits of regular training. They need the camaraderie and the incentive to "stick with it" that only we can provide.
 - 2. As a corollary of (1) above, we ought to forget about "conflicts" in meets and barge ahead with scheduling meets wherever sufficient interest is indicated. Generally speaking, we compete in those meets we are best suited for, whether it be a sophisticated world-class track competition, a big traditional cross-country run, or a local sand-lot "joggers' mile." The latter create interest in the former, in the long run, both from a spectator standpoint and from a competitor's standpoint. So-called "conflicts" do nothing worse than require decisive action in a few isolated instances, and decisions are healthy for any man -- or woman.
 - 3. As seniors, our attitudes and interests indicate better-than-average leaning toward community services. But we must be practical. My idea for a blood bank last year was listened to attentively, and that is all I asked for. It turned out to be impractical, but there are other activities in which we could be very effective. I think officiating at the "Retarded Olympics" may be excellent. It It certainly presents a marvelous opportunity for advertising the club, as suggested in (1) above. But for goodness' sakes let's get the newspapers to print the address and telephone number of our membership chairman. And if possible a description of our activities in general.

Let's have some comments along these lines.

Jim O'Neil now has two consecutive wins in this race, and the best scratch time for a third year. (It was a handicap race in 1971.) His time, while terrific, left his record 26:37 of 1972 still standing. Eve Barraza's 1972 women's record of 33:32 also stood up, but her 33:59 indicates she has worked her way back to the same ability she had before her injuries. Total number of finishers was up from previous high of 101 in 1972.
