MEMBER OF THE MONTH

Sexagenarian Bill Monheit has been a member of NCSTC since 1970. Now enjoying retirement he has the opportunity to indulge such varied interests as chess playing, ballroom dancing, symphony going, lecture attending, - and, not least, road running at 6:00 AM each morning on a beautiful course adjacent to his residence at the Parkwoods Apartments in Oakland, usually four miles on weekdays, and six miles on weekends.

Bill is imbued with an enthusiasm for distance running, but characterizes himself as a modest performer, only occasionally winning a place medal in age group competitions. He enters eight to ten road races each year, including:



At the AAU WESTERN MASTERS TRACK & FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS to be held in Oakland on July 5 & 6 Bill will compete in age group division 3B, and has entered the 1,500 meter, the 10,000 meter, and the 5,000 meter runs. He makes no predictions, but says that at least he will have the association of some good runners.

In common with all our running brethern, Bill is a strong advocate of physical fitness. Strenuous stressing of the body, counterbalanced with aesthetic and intellectual activity, constitute Bill's life style. In this he is joined by Ruth, who shares with him this basic philosophy, and together they enjoy a zestful life.

Bill has served NCSTC in a number of capacities. During the two presidential terms of Emmett Smith in 1970 and 1971 Bill was appointed to the Board of Directors as Member-at-Large. During this tenure Bill was responsible for computerizing the Club's membership records, and he produced the Club's first Membership Directory. In 1973 Bill served as President of NCSTC.

In March of this year Bill was elected to the office of Secretary-Treasurer of the AAU WESTERN MASTERS, and now is busily engaged in the organization of the Regional Champtonships to be held at Laney College, Oakland, on July 5 & 6.






