Sharlet Gilbert most outstanding long distance runner. Sharlet was first master in many marathons-Las Vegas, Pittsburgh, City of San Francisco(2:42:06), Grandma's Marathon in Duluth(2:38-personal best), Twin Cities in Minneapolis/Saint Paul (2:40:19), Community First Fox Cities(2:39:58) and won many shorter runs.

John Burns most outstanding track and field athlete. John won the M50 javelin event each time he competed, including the Spokane Nationals(170' 6"), and he threw 173' 1" in April. TROPHYS to -

Shirley Dietderich, who won her W65 javelin and discus events at the Spokane Nationals and has been a dedicated and frequent competitor, for throwing.

<u>Craig Boyak</u> (M38), who is our most talented pole vaulter and won all the meets he attended except for second place (16') at the Nationals, for <u>jumps</u>.

Barbara Robben (W55), who ran 66 races, including 4 triathlons, 5 biathlons, and 5 half marathons and was ranked first Senior Woman in the PAC/TAC Cross-Country Grand Prix, for long distance running.

Louis Bartholomew (M35), who always won his 110M hurdle event with times in the 14's or 15's, for sprints.

Tom Silva (M33), who threw 212'8" in the May 26,1992, Las Vegas Fire Fighters Championships, and wins in his javelin competition at all times, for throwing.

Michael P. Ackley (M45) second in the Naperville Nationals Pentathon and in the Spokane Nationals Masters Pentathon.

Ruth Anderson (W60) for long distance and cross-country running, including club team running. She was second Super Senior in the PAC/TAC Grand Prix, and she was second F60 in the Dec. 6, 1993 Louisville, KY National Championship 10K.

Bob Malain (M65) ranked second Super Senior in the PAC/TAC Cross-Country Grand Prix and 8th Super Senior in LDR Grand Prix. His 43:51 in the Nov. S. F. Cross-Country was superb.

Dick Laine (M60) was 4th Super Senior in the PAC/TAC LDR Grand Prix. He modestly reports his 1992 was not as good as 1991.

Kit Pickles (66) was ranked first Super Senior Woman in the PA/TAC Cross-Country Grand Prix. She won 32 of 36 runs.
