In absence of the Secretary-Treasurer, the minutes of the last meeting and the treasurer's report will be presented at the next meeting.

The President's establishment of committees and representatives:

Mark Grubi will continue as Coach and Josephine Kolda will continue as Editor of the Club newsletter. Ruth Anderson is Chairman of the Club's LDR Committee and representative to the PA/USA LDR Committee meetings. Kay Yeck is Chairman of the Club's T&F Committee and representative to the PA/USA T&F Committee meetings. TRACK AND FIELD RESULTS --

Those getting an early start on the track and field season, took a chance on the weather at Edwards Field, U.C. Berkeley All-comers meets on Saturdays, with the following results. Bruce Hotaling pole vaulted 13'6" Feb. 6. Andrew Kearns has been throwing the javelin in at least 3 meets: 54.16M Jan 30, 177'10" Feb. 6. Tom Silva's javelin throw on that day was 200'5". On Jan. 30 Martyn Adamson threw the javelin 38.16 meters, long jumped 15'7", tossed the discus 21.5 meters and sprinted the 200 in 25.5. He explained that he plans to do the sprints at the world meet in Japan, but he is preparing himself by training pentathlon and decathlon events. Roger Werne cleared 12' in the pole vault Jan. 23 and 30 (let us know, Roger, if you did even better in February.) Barbara Robben tried the track Feb. 13 with a 93.8 400M, 3:32.4 800M and 25:20.8 5K (W55-59 group).

Ruth Anderson reported a first place Dec. 30-31 at the Gibson 24 hours run, 78 miles; and also at the Ledson Marsh 50 Miles, January 30.
