At the June 12, Los Gatos Championships, Dan Behrens triple jumped 37'4" (a good 4 feet further than this time last year). Further performances at this meet were:

Roger Werne pole vaulted 12'1½" (3rd-M45).

<u>Jerry Silsdorf</u> (M70) had a good day with firsts in the shot put  $(27'10\frac{1}{2}")$ , long jump  $(9'4\frac{1}{2}")$  and the high jump (3'10") and second in the discus (27.14 meters).

<u>Bob Stone</u> (M70) won the discus (23.74) and shot (24'4").

<u>Jim York</u> (M80) was second (to Ross Carter) with a  $29'10\frac{1}{2}$ " in the shot.

Shirler Dietderich (W65) reported 2 wins in the javelin (63' $1\frac{1}{2}$ ") and discus (56' $9\frac{1}{4}$ "); she also reported Fran Conley (W50) won with 102'6" javelin throw.

John Burns reported Phil Conley (M55) won the javelin with about 150'; also John Burns (M50) reported a 1993 PR (first) with his 167' javelin.
