



Awards were made to two members who brought back a gold medal from the Masters world meet in Japan. On the top left MARTYN ADAMSON is honored for his part in the M55-59 winning 4 X 400 relay and second place 4 X 100 relay; and he ran good against his many competitors in that age group. Although often plagued by muscle strains, he was probably the most dependable club competitor for giving an exciting winning performance. His spirit woul not let him be less than firs (with one exception, a second SHIRLEY DIETDERICH was the third leg on the winning W65-

third leg on the winning W65-69 4 X 100 relay. Her jave-lin throw fell into 4th place She competed often in 1993 for the club. (She is pictured on the left).

JUDY ACE (42), (pictured 3rd down on the left) was given an outstanding performance award as the club's best master's woman sprinter. She won all of her races, includ-

ing an impressive Bruce Jenner win in San Jose Her times were always good and she represented the club well.

<u>DWAYNE JONES</u> (now 34) (pictured on bottom left was honored as the club's best sub-master sprinter; his times, as a beginner were sensational.

FRANK TONER (73) (bottom right) was honored as the club's most outstanding 70+ sprinter. He represented the club well with his wins in several 100 and 100 meter races. He won the 70+ Bruce Jenner sprint—with Payton Jordan's retirement, he became the favored one.

JIM YORK (80), who had both world and American records in the shot and hammer. He competed often and well in his field events.

KEN CARNINE (age 86) had a world record javelin throw in the M85-89 group, $79'11\frac{1}{2}"$.

Both Ken and Jim sent their regards to all their friends and regrets that they could not be present at the annual meeting.

TWO MORE NAMES WERE ADDED to the <u>CLUB's PERPETUAL</u> <u>TROPHY</u>, sculptured in 1981 by 1979 President Ruth Waters:

RAY YECK (45) an outstanding 1993 track man, for his very close competition to the best in the U.S., Stan Whitley and Bob Mitchell, and for his frequent good competition and dedication to the club; and

BARBARA ROBBEN (59), a consistant LDR performer, with 54 1993 events, including many age group wins, and nothing less than third.






